## 5. Administrative and Committee Reports

5.1 Principal Reports

Mr. Ellerman shared the elementary school has done a nice job transitioning into their new school. There have been some hiccups with technology issues which have created

some issues with our remote learning, but the staff has done a nice job making adjustments as necessary. There are activities planned for Halloween but the traditional trick or treating at the local businesses will not happen due to the pandemic. Mr. Arnsman shared that both the middle school and high school staff have done very well returning to in-person learning. Everyone has had to make adjustments to the schedule and the protocols put in place to help mitigate the spread of covid-19. One of the areas the staff is concentrating on are students that are not performing well either in-person or remotely. Mr. Ansman also commented on the great effort the Student Council has done with their Kasparie fundraiser. The goal they are hoping to reach is \$10,000 and they believe they should be able to reach it.

- 5.2 Business Manager Report
  - Mrs. Whelan shared the district has done well in the first quarter of the year. Expenses are at 37% but that includes some construction billing that has come due. The district had anticipated a decrease in revenue from the state and local resources due to the pandemic and that has proven to be true.
- 5.3 Special Education Coordinator

  Mrs. Gronewold provided the board with data on allowable percentages of special education students in regular education classes. She also shared the one of the district's goals is to provide a Multi-tiered System of Supports (MTTS) for struggling students. There is now in place a problem solving team in each building that will work to provide support for these students.
- 5.4 Curriculum, Assessment and Technology Director
  Mr. Klusmeyer was pleased to announce that the iPads for the K-2 students have been
  distributed to the classrooms for student use. This has been an initiative that Supt.
  Riddle and the Leadership Team have been working on and are happy to see it being
  realized. Mr. Klusmeyer also explained the professional development provided to the
  staff during the last Teacher Institute day on student engagement and also on the new
  ELA program and curriculum at the elementary level.
- 5.5 Superintendent Report
  - Supt. Riddle was pleased to announce the first quarter has gone remarkably well. We have only had 7 positive cases up to this point (3 students and 4 staff). The good news is that in-school transmission is almost non-existent and the cases we are seeing in Adams County are being spread within families or at social gatherings and not at school. The biggest impact we see for our students are from covid-like symptoms or from potential exposure. This is where we see our absences due to quarantining. Supt. Riddle shared remote learners account for approximately 8% of our student population which in physical numbers equals 54 students. This is down from 11% during the first quarter (72 students). The challenge we are faced with is work completion by our remote learners. The admins and staff are trying to come up with a solution to deal with this issue. We are encouraging the parents of our remote learners to monitor their students to make sure they are completing their work. If they are having difficulty to please reach out to their teachers.

Compliments go out to our staff for stepping up and helping out whenever and however it is needed. We have all pitched in to make things work. We have had days where different teachers have stepped in to help with breakfast and lunch due to a shortage of staff. I think some of them really enjoy it. I know the kids do. The day I got to help out was pizza day! Kids love you when you feed them pizza!

Supt. Riddle again thanked our pares and bus drivers for all they have done to make our in-person learning successful. It starts with them every day getting our students here safely after screening them. This was a major concern and they have made it go like clockwork.
