Ron Frericks and Brian Frericks QFB Energy - Solar Array Exploratory Presentation Chuck Klapatauskas Ideal Energy

A presentation was given on the possibility of looking at using a solar array to generate electricity for the elementary school and high school. Preliminary engineering studies were conducted and shared with the board with some predicted equipment and maintenance costs and possible revenue potential. The impetus for this is substantial incentives are available for schools that were not previously. The board directed them to put together more substantial information and provide it for the board to review and make available to the community.

Brandy Zanger and Angie Altenhein - Two of our first grade teachers shared the incredible experience the elementary students had with the Star Lab. Mrs. Zanger shared she had written a grant which was funded by the Unit Four Foundation for \$1600 which enabled the entire elementary school to enjoy the educational science program.

### 5. Administrative and Committee Reports

5.1 Principal Reports

Mr. Arnsman introduced Ms. Hartley the new elementary and middle school counselor. He also introduced Ms. Brueck the new Music teacher. Mr. Arnsman let the board know that we have had many staff and students out with sickness. He thanked his staff for helping to cover when needed. In mid February we will be having Parent-Teacher conferences.

Mrs. Sheffler welcomed the new staff members as well and complimented them on how quickly they had acclimated to the district. She also thanked her 1st grade teachers for attending and sharing about the Star Lab. She echoed Mr. Arnsman's comments about sickness being pervasive in the elementary creating some very challenging staffing issues. She thanked her staff for all they are doing to help cover classes as needed. Mrs. Sheffler shared Friday the 20th will be the Mother-Son Dance at the elementary school.

Mrs. Sheffler informed the board that she has begun weekly staff meetings surrounding professional development for the new ELA and Math programs as well as beginning a book study group.

# 5.2 Business Manager Report

Mrs. Whelan let the board know that we are 50% through the year and have only expended 46%. Fiscally the district is doing very well. At this point we have received 78% of our revenue.

### 5.3 Special Education Coordinator

Mrs. Stegner presented to the board on the current percentages of special education students at each grade level. District wide we have seen stable numbers.

## 5.4 Curriculum, Assessment and Technology Director

Mr. Klusmeyer let the board know that MAP testing will be at the end of the month. These benchmarking tests allow teachers to guide their instruction based upon where students are. He also indicated he was working with our SchoolMessenger system to send out automated messages with report cards.

## 5.5 Superintendent Report

Supt. Riddle said we are up and running in our second semester. We started off the semester with a Teacher Institute day where we had presentations for professional development for the staff on Social Emotional Learning involving Trauma and the Effects on the Brain and Instructional Strategies for Increasing Student Engagement and Learning. These sessions were well received by the staff and we have had many positive comments about the information presented.

Supt. Riddle shared with the board that we have met with the Custodial Crew for one of our Talking Circles as part of our ongoing Listening & Learning communication plan. It was a good meeting and we were able to identify some areas for improvement and suggestions on things to help make the cleaning more efficient.

The seniority list for staff is being circulated for them to approve. This list is used in the event we would need to RIF anyone. We have not done that since I have been here and do not anticipate doing that this year. Administrators are completing staff first round evaluations for non-tenure teachers.

There are many new laws that were enacted January 1 for education. One that will impact us is the "Waiver of Fines." This includes new parameters than were previously included. We have to provide notification of the waiver ability with every bill for fees or fines. Another one is the new attendance waiver for students to take a day for Civic Events.

The Minimum Wage increase has to be \$15/hour by 2025. Currently the wage requirement is \$13/hour. We proactively increased our salaries to keep and attract staff. Supt. Riddle also made note of the teacher salary minimum after 2025 will be tied to CPI and the fluctuation we have seen as of late could be very impactful to a school budget.

Supt. Riddle let the board know he was going to be meeting with the architect and HVAC contractor for the elementary to deal with some continuing issues we have had. We are also meeting to discuss some Health Life Safety issues identified in the last ROE/Fire Marshal walk thru.
